

NATIONAL ORGANISATION OF MINING HISTORY ORGANISATIONS

PRIVACY POLICY

This policy was revised following discussion at the NAMHO Council Meeting on 20 March 2021.

The NATIONAL ORGANISATION OF MINING HISTORY ORGANISATIONS (NAMHO) holds and processes personal data of people representing its Member Organisations (MO).

The data NAMHO holds is that provided when applying to join NAMHO as an MO and is updated if informed of any changes.

NAMHO may hold the names, email addresses and postal addresses of the NAMHO Representative of the MO and of selected Officers of the MO.

NAMHO keeps this information whilst the MO's subscription is current and it may be held for three years after the subscription has expired or the MO resigns its membership.

NAMHO uses this data to carry out its legitimate business, including notifying MOs of AGMs, EGMs, Council Meetings, emailing / posting our newsletter and other relevant communications.

NAMHO will not share or sell personal data with or to anyone else.

NAMHO only stores this information in locally-held computer file(s) that are password protected. It will only be held by NAMHO Officers who need it to carry out NAMHO's legitimate business. NAMHO will create email groups for specific purposes (for example for notice of meetings and for newsletter distribution); this is done in a way which does not reveal email addresses to other MOs.

If an MO wants to know the personal data held by NAMHO, the MO can email or write to the Treasurer who will send it to you. You can correct, amend and ask for personal data. If an MO is not satisfied with how NAMHO have handled your personal data, you can complain to our Treasurer or, ultimately, to the UK Information Commissioner.

This policy has been written to take account of changes to data protection legislation that came into effect on 25 May 2018.
